"We've Got A Situation Here," the lead single off The Damned Things debut album, *Ironiclast*, joins "Rescue Me" from Hawthorne Heights' third studio album, *Fragile Future*, "Wings Of A Butterfly," by HIM and "Buried Myself Alive," off The Used 2002 self titled debut album.
